Pakistan sends Lord Buddha's relics to Sri Lanka

In order to present the richest Buddhist historical legacy to the Sri Lankan people, Pakistan has sent the most sacred relics of the Lord Buddha to Sri Lanka. These relics arrived in Sri Lanka on 3 June 2011 for a limited period and were exhibited at Colombo Museum during the month of June.



The honourable Speaker to Sri Lanka Chamal Rajapaksa received the sacred relics at the airport along with the High Commissioner of Pakistan Seema Ilahi Baloch and officials of the Pakistan High Commission.

Dr. Paul Bhatti, Advisor to the Prime Minister of Pakistan on Minorities Affairs and a high level team of archeology Department of Pakistan



brought these relics to Sri Lanka.

The relics are valuable part of the archeological heritage of Pakistan and depicts the rich Buddhist history of Pakistan. The President of Sri Lanka Mahinda Rajapaksa inaugurated the sacred relics at Maligakanda Temple in Colombo for the public exposition.

The exhibition in Colombo displayed these high quality cultural assets from the Gandhara region of Pakistan and encompassed four sacred artifacts/relics. The artifacts/relics consist of the collection of Peshawar and Taxila Museum, of Pakistan.

After the conclusion of the successful exhibition these relics were taken back to Pakistan on 21 June 2011.

Pakistan awards Jinnah Scholarships to 107 Sri Lankan students

The government of Pakistan, through its High Commission in Colombo, recently awarded scholarships to the value of SL Rs.2.6 million to 107 Sri Lankan students who had passed the GCE Ordinary and Advanced Level examinations. The scholarships were awarded under the Jinnah Educational Scholarship Programme. The award ceremony was held at Ananda College Colombo. The Chief Guest was Justice Minister Rauf Hakeem. The High Commissioner of Pakistan Seema Ilahi Baloch, Embassy officials and other officials participated in the ceremony. Pakistan has been awarding the Jinnah Educational Scholarships since 2005 and so far over 800 Sri Lankan students have benefited from the scheme.



Sri Lanka elected as Chairman

Sri Lanka was elected Chairman of the Asia Region Committee of the United Nations Habitat for the next two years at the 23rd sessions held in Nairobi, Kenya recently.

Construction, Engineering Services Housing and Common Amenities Minister Wimal Weerawansa who led the Sri Lanka delegation to the Sessions said that it was vital to find a common solution for regional housing issues.

Pakistan assured its fullest cooperation to Sri Lanka's stand. A common housing policy will be implemented in the SAARC region countries in the future. When Sri Lanka delegation drew the attention of the United Nations Human Settlement Commission's Executive Dr. John Crooze on its housing and human settlement program the latter expressed his willingness to provide assistance after studying on Sri Lanka's housing and settlements development program.
